The organization is a faith-based, non-profit group home for mentally or developmentally challenged adults, 18 years and older, who can do many things, just should never live alone. While Bright Life is state licensed, it is not state supported.

At this date, Bright Life has three residential homes with private rooms/baths for 24 special men and women. Plans include a fourth home that will have eight additional rooms. As a faith-based facility, their goal is to provide care for the whole person – body and spirit – within an environment of love and safety, structure, training and enrichments with the goal of each individual living to the fullest. Bright Life's philosophy is that they have the right to develop independent living skills, become productive citizens, maintain an attitude of selfworth, attain their highest degrees of mental, spiritual, physical and vocational achievement, and most importantly, participate as members of a family.




